



Score the short strip at 1", 1 ½", 2 ½" and 3" Sore the long strip at 1 ½", 2", 3 ½" and 4"



Crease along the score lines and form the strips into rectangular shapes. Secure with glue. I use the green Tombow Mono Multi Adhesive, it gives you a little time to make sure the rectangles are perfectly symmetrical before it bonds.



Once you've decorated the back panel, attach the boxes as shown in the picture. Make sure that they are flush with the bottom and side edges. I put the larger box on the left-hand side. Again, these were adhered with Tombow Mono Multi.




To attach the front panels, fold the left-hand side box down towards the centre and place glue on the facing end, as shown.

You can now glue down the larger rectangle.

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You can see from the picture that when you adhere the front panels, you should make sure that the bottom and the edges are flush with the back panel of the card.



When both front panels have been attached, your card will look like this!



Decorate the panels as you like. This is a very versatile pattern and can also be made 'portrait'. See sizing below.
